Helping people in "forgotten" disaster-stricken areas rebuild their lives

Support through the activities of Peace Winds Japan

Peace Winds Japan, a non-profit organization (NPO) established in Japan in 1996, has a team of around 600 staff members working on a variety of humanitarian activities around the world. The Kuraray Foundation primarily provides support to disaster-stricken areas where relief efforts become increasingly difficult over time, hampering their ability to recover.

Areas affected by flooding in western Japan in 2018: Support for Mabi-cho, Kurashiki City

Donation of books

We donated 876 books and equipment to the community library, which had lost over 90% of its collection. Two and a half years later, the library reopened and is now being used by many people.

Areas affected by hurricanes and earthquakes: Support for Haiti

Haiti was devastated by a powerful hurricane in 2016, followed by a major earthquake in 2021. Instead of providing temporary economic support, we are helping people to become self-reliant through economic activities, and are also providing training to improve living conditions in terms of such things as safety and hygiene.
